



2022 Y-FLYER INTERNATIONAL REGATTA

July 12 - 15 Saratoga Lake Sailing Club Ballston Spa, NY

Come early and stay late for the Y-Flyer International Regatta in July!

Colloquially called Saratoga, the full name of the city is actually Saratoga Springs.

The Saratoga Springs area of Upstate New York is a tourist haven. Since 1863, horse racing has been the heart and soul of Saratoga.

From Planetware.com: "Located in eastern Saratoga County, Saratoga Lake is one of the premiere tourist attractions in Saratoga Springs. In summer in particular, Saratoga Lake becomes the heart and soul of the destination."

The Saratoga area includes the Horse Racing National Hall of Fame and Museum, The Saratoga Automobile Museum, The Roosevelt Mineral Baths and Spa (you can bathe in the waters), The Saratoga National Battlefield, The Yaddo Botanical Gardens, Saratoga Spa State Park, National Museum of Dance, the New York State Military Museum and the Saratoga Springs History Museum. In addition, there are the Adirondack Mountains within a short drive as well as President Grant's Cottage where he finished his memoirs just before he died.

The main street in Saratoga is filled with shops and restaurants.

The Dave Matthews Band is scheduled for July 8th and 9th at SPAC (Saratoga Performing Arts Center) then Chicago and Brian Wilson are scheduled for July 17th.

About a mile or two south of Saratoga Lake is the Malta Movie Drive-In as well as the Albany-Saratoga Raceway for dirt track car racing.
